As an example, you'll learn about effective communication, managing conflict and the principles of leading both the youth and the adults of your unit or district. Wood Badge training is offered by the National Boy Scouts of America and the lessons learned go far beyond any other training course available through the Scouting movement at the District level, Council level, and the National BSA Philmont Training Center.
